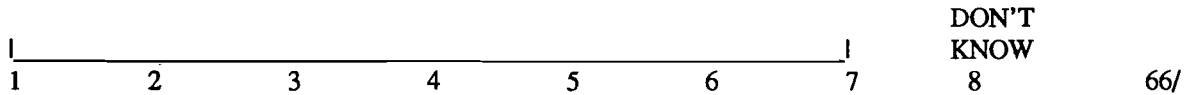

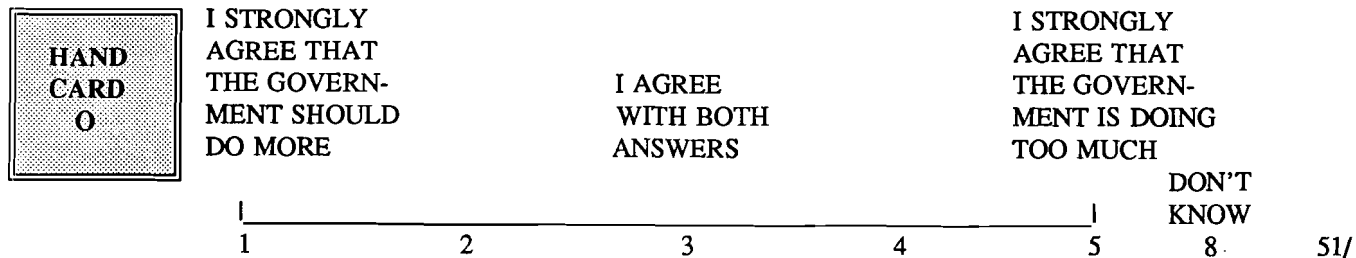

A. Where would you place yourself on this scale, or haven't you made up your mind on this?

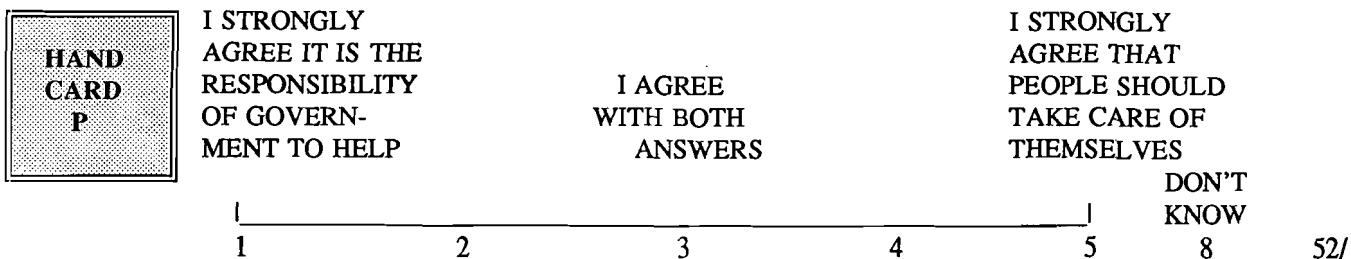

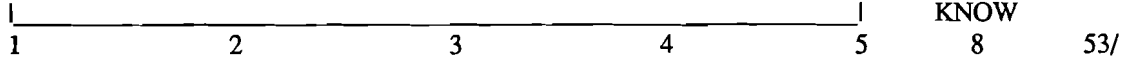
