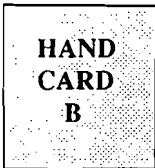

Now, I'd like you to consider the seriousness of various events. We're going to use the seriousness of being fired or permanently laid-off as a reference point. We're going to give it an (arbitrary) seriousness score of 200 (HAND CARD B). As we ask about other events, we want you to compare how serious you feel they are compared to the score of 200 for being fired or permanently laid-off. For example, if you thought an event was three times as serious as being fired or permanently laid-off, you would give it a score of 600; if you thought an event was only half as serious, you would give it a score of 100. Of course, if you felt it was exactly as serious as being fired or permanently laid-off, you would give it the same score-- that is, 200. You can use *any* number greater than 200 *or* smaller than 200 to indicate how serious you think the event is.



First, consider having a cold for a couple days, compared to a score of 200 for being fired or permanently laid-off. How serious is having a cold for a couple days. . .

And compared to a score of 200 for being fired or permanently laid-off, how serious is being permanently paralyzed in an automobile accident. . .
